The Matrix is a 1999 science fiction-action film written and directed by Larry and Andy Wachowski, starring Keanu Reeves, Laurence Fishburne, Carrie-Anne Moss, Joe Pantoliano, and Hugo Weaving. It was first released in Australia on April 8, 1999, and is the first installment in the *Matrix* series of films. The Wachowski brothers tell a classic story of man vs machine where only one can prevail. The film is set in the future a world where machines rule the world. It is around the year 2200, the humans had blown up the sun in attempt to destroy them. Their artificial intelligence allowed them to make a fake world, simulation a computer program. The machines now have captured all but few humans and enslaved their mind and bodies in pods full of liquid. Their minds lie in the matrix, which is set in the year 1999.
